THINGS TO DO NOW

Consent and Release Form

Please log into your VIMS account and complete the form if not already completed. Here is the link to sign in.

Once you have signed in, on the left side of the page there is a link labeled "Consent & Release". Read the form, and follow the directions to electronically sign and submit the form (you will need to check a box!)

WHAT TO WEAR WHEN YOU COME TO VOLUNTEER:

- Long pants only, (blue jeans are just fine)
- Closed-toe/heel shoes. No sandals, Clogs or Crocs.
- Safety Glasses!!
 - Everyone must wear Safety Glasses! We have "loaners" but you will be more comfortable if you have your own personal pair of Safety Glasses.

WHAT TO BRING:

- WATER & Refillable Water Bottles: Water bottle filling stations will be available. Please bring your own labeled water bottle.
- Like hot coffee and/or tea? Please bring a thermal mug! Hot beverages are
 provided during regular meal service and near the event office. The La Crosse
 Center concessions also sell beverages. Concession stands will be open 10:00
 AM to 4:00 PM Thursday Saturday.
- We will try to have staff on duty at all times in the volunteer lounge, but it would be best to keep valuables with you.

PARKING

The best place to park is the Riverside Ramp at 2nd & Jay Streets. There are over 800 free spots, but they go fast. Please park on upper levels. It is a short walk to the volunteer entrance. Other ramps do have fees. Find a map here: https://www.cityoflacrosse.org/police/parkingfacilities

WHERE TO ENTER THE LACROSSE CENTER

Best entrance for Volunteers will be from Front Street, this is on the Riverside Park side (West) of the La Crosse Center. Some people will call it the "back" of the Center. There will be a signed door.

Enter and take elevator up to the Volunteer Check In / Lounge – Patrick Zielke Suite. Watch for signage!

If you are staying in the Radisson Hotel, the Patrick Zielke Suite is accessible by skyway from the hotel.

You can also access the Volunteer area via the Box Office Entrance, however, in the morning those doors will be locked to teams until the event opens.
